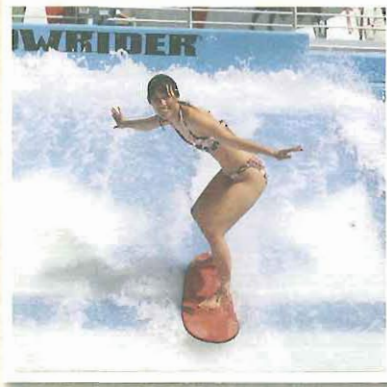

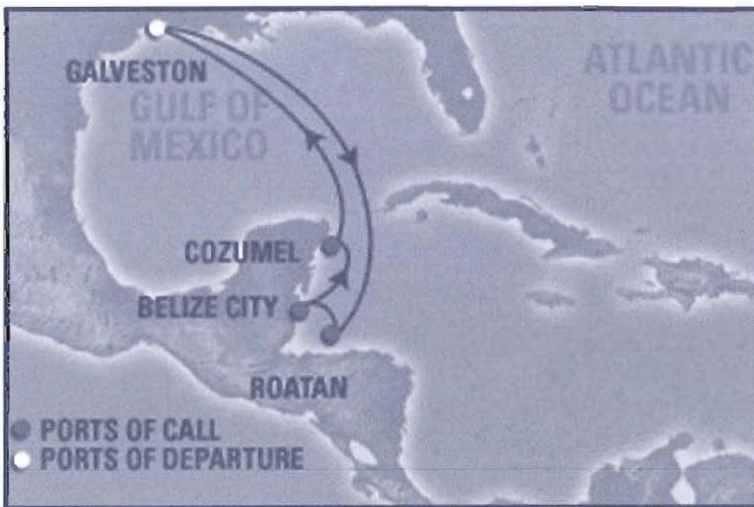

The Marvelous Mariner of the Seas

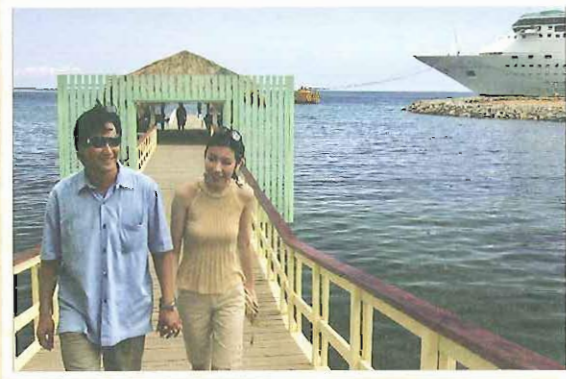
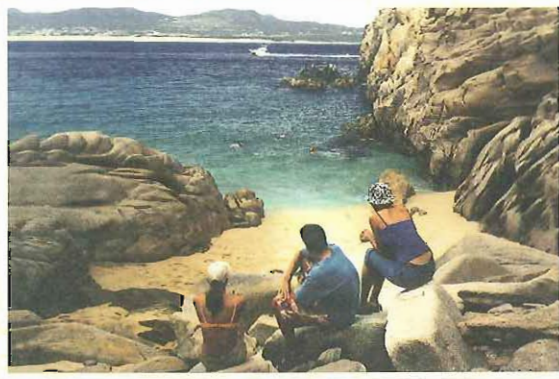

The Caribbean Coast of Central America is a tropical paradise. Sun drenched shores, endless miles of sugary sand beaches and crystal clear water that beckons sportsmen, adventurers and vacationers alike. Those seeking tranquility and natural beauty are in harmony with those seeking thrills and excitement. Here you'll find an enchanted combination: some of the most magnificent coral reefs in the world coupled with ancient Mayan temples and indigenous native people hand-crafting baskets, ceramics, and textiles all set against the back drop of lush and abundant rain forests

Roatan, Honduras

This truly unspoiled island is surrounded by the world's second largest coral reef, home to hundreds of varieties of incredible sea creatures. Belize City, Belize

Located between Mexico and Guatemala, Belize possesses a unique combination of modernity and rustic Caribbean charm. Ancient ruins indicate that Belize was first inhabited by the Mayans in 300 B.C., so take this chance to climb to the top of El Castillo. From here, you can see the lush rainforest of Peten, the Mayan Mountains and even across the border into Guatemala. Keep your eyes open for flocks of toucans and parrots in the trees below. Other wildlife, such as jaguars, pumas, crocodiles and wild howler monkeys can be found at the Baboon Sanctuary, Belize Zoo and along the Old Belize River. During your visit, be sure to stroll through the marketplace and mingle with the local vendors selling fruits, vegetables and arts and crafts.

Cozumel, Mexico

The Conquistadors first saw Mexico from the shores of Cozumel while searching for gold. Today, visitors to the island continue to seek out gold and silver jewelry in the shops of San Miguel, while exploring the many local watering holes and cafes. Regarded as the "St. Thomas of the Western Caribbean", Cozumel has become one of the world's best duty free shopping ports. Tear yourself away from shopping long enough to discover all the other treasures that Cozumel offers. Explore the underwater world on a deep sea adventure onboard the Atlantis submarine. Swim with an amazing dolphin in the National Marine Park. Play a championship round of golf at the Cozumel Country Club. Learn to prepare a Mexican Feast at a festive culinary experience. Take a Jeep-Safari through the tropical landscape, or escape to the secluded beauty of your own private Beach paradise, Passion island.
