• I&M Canal Boat Tour:

Journey back in time aboard the "Volunteer," a 70-passenger, mule-pulled 1840's replica canal boat as it coasts gently up and down the I&M Canal. Climb aboard for an hour of peaceful, historical fun! Families of all ages, historians, photographers and nature lovers will love this historic journey into Illinois' scenic past!

Lunch at Starved Rock:

Perched on a bluff high above the scenic Illinois River Valley is this laid-back bar. Stay cool in the dinning hall as you enjoy a fresh made meal with a view. You will leave satisfied and relaxed for our afternoon adventures!

Old Joliet Prison

The Old Joliet Prison was built in the 1850's, housing infamous criminals like Leopold, Loeb and Gacy. The prison also housed some famous characters, including "Joliet" Jake Blues (The Blues Brothers) and Michael Scofield and Lincoln Burrons (Prison Break). The castle-like Prison was built with Joliet limestone, with over 20 buildings inside its four walls.

Bishop's Hill Winery

Located in the historic "castle", the winery imports grapes directly from California, and use their years of wine making experience to produce the best wine possible. They are currently developing their processing tunnel using an unearthed tunnel below the castle that will keep their wines at a consistent 57 degree temperature.
